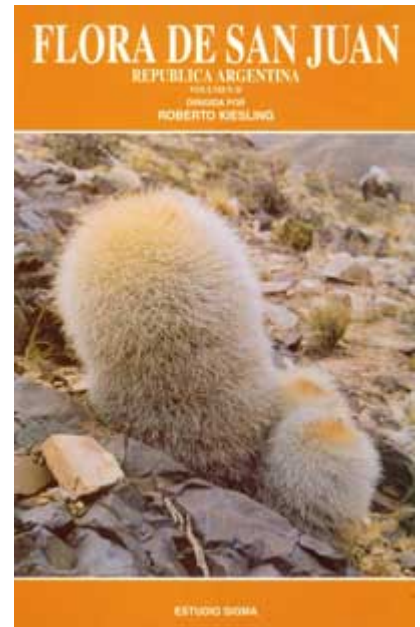

This is an article (in Spanish) stemming from the PhD Thesis of Roberto which was defended in 1976. Initially, Roberto wanted to study *Gymnocalycium*, but the work revealed to be overwhelming. He thus decided to focus on a smaller genus, i.e., *Trichocereus*. With his first wife, he made three field trips using a French 2 CV pick-up (Citroën) as a camping car. The resulting work is still valid although some recombinations have been published. It is furthermore of great help since *Trichocereus* are rarely seen in collections because of their dimensions.

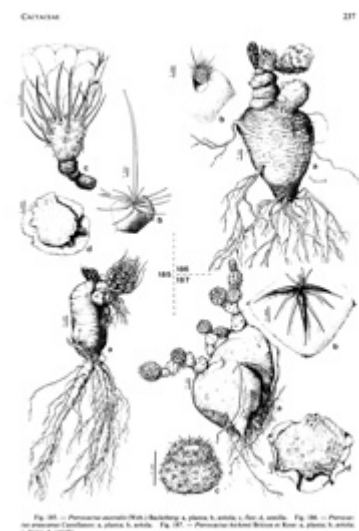
